IMPROVING FARMING AND THE BOTTOM LINE

The introduction of a new irrigation system for the avocado grove at Life Unlimited has made valuable improvements to the crop yield as well as the bottom line. With this improved hydration, the grove has the potential to generate \$32,500 annually, enough to cover a significant portion of Life Unlimited's budget.

A newly formed Young Mothers program at the Ryazan Ministry Center provides support to five young mothers with children under three. These young mothers, who grew up without parents of their own, are now learning the skills needed to best love and care for their little ones. ENRICHING LIVES THROUGH EDUCATION

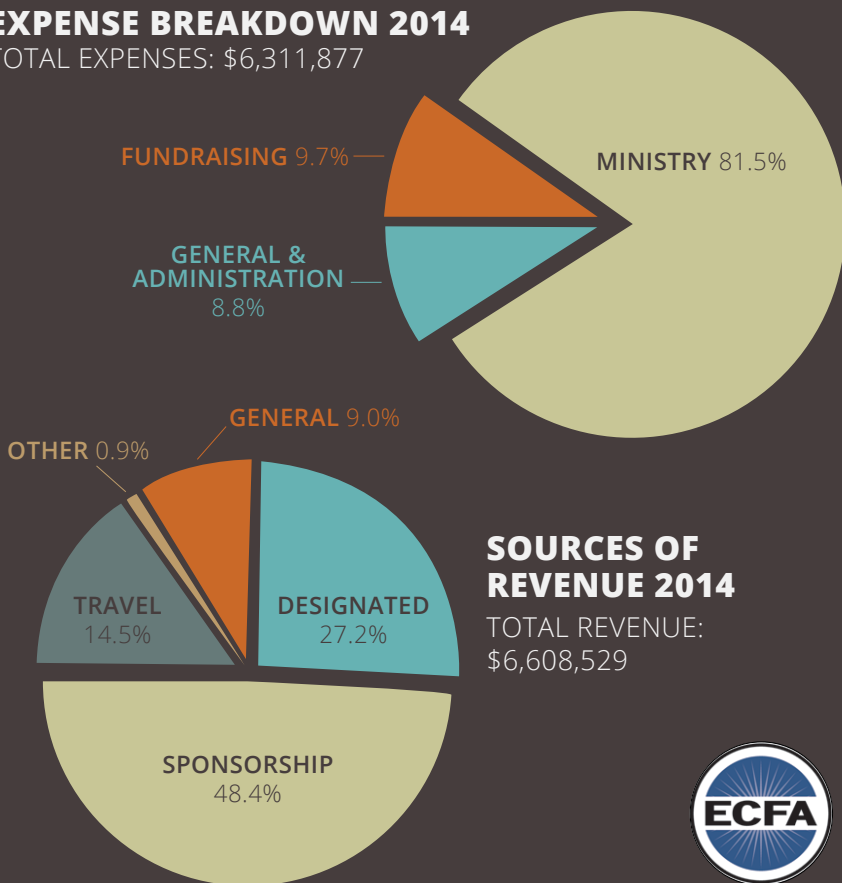

EXPENSE BREAKDOWN 2014

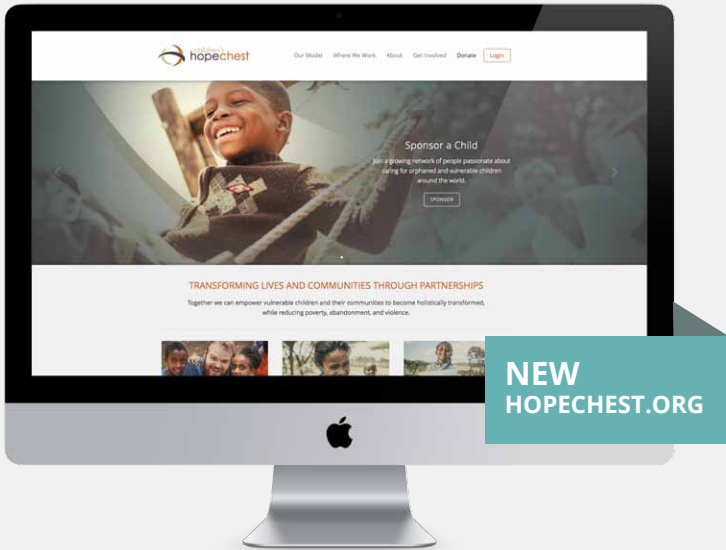
TOTAL EXPENSES: \$6,311,877
